Australian Society for Promoting Education (ASPE)

Who are we?

Australian Society for Promoting Education (ASPE) has been established as an Australian community sponsored organization in order to support needy students acquire and advance their education. ASPE has been working as an Australian registered organization since May 2012.

Our Focus—Promoting Education

ASPE's focus is to establish community sponsored education support initiatives for students of low socio-economic status in developing countries and to provide guidance for higher education opportunities in Australian Universities. Education quality and literacy rate are far too low in many parts of world giving rise to complex socio-economic and character building issues. In order to help alleviate these issues, ASPE has taken initiatives to help students in those parts of the world.

It is not the aim to restrict support to any area or level of education. Any identified support need, beginning from primary level to secondary and higher education as well as trade education can be part of the support program.

Our Approach

ASPE's approach is to engage community and community organizations to identify and take part in education support programs. ASPE makes effort to look for need areas and volunteers to design and support projects.

Once the projects are designed and management arrangements are made, community is then approached to pool the funds to meet the support requirements.

Well designed processes are in place to ensure fairness and transparency is maintained during all stages of the projects. For example ASPE awards financial assistance by following a selection procedure based on students academic performance and their financial status

Current Projects

School Education

ASPE is currently providing assistance in three rural areas in Pakistan. By June 2016, a total of 66 school students in Brotha, Bahawalnagar and Faisalabad are receiving assistance. Each area is managed by a local volunteer. The management covers identification of needy students, distribution of assistance and monitoring progress. Where possible, assistance is provide in kind in terms of books, uniform, stationary and payment of fees directly to school.

Trade Education

ASPE is currently providing assistance to trade education students in Government College of Technology in Lahore region. Starting from 10 students from 1st year batch, ASPE plans to increase the number at least by 10 every year. Based on satisfactory academic performance the assistance continues throughout the length of course, which is usually 3 years.

Higher Education

Supporting higher education students was the first project started by ASPE. By June 2016 a total of 20 students in University of Agriculture Faisalabad (UAF) are receiving assistance from ASPE.

ASPE works with UAF administration to select needy students, manage funds disbursement and reporting progress. Based on satisfactory academic performance the assistance continues throughout the length of course, which is usually 4 years.

Guidance for Australian Ph. D Scholarships

ASPE has taken the initiative to provide guidance to overseas graduate students for Ph. D scholarship opportunities in Australia.

Future Aims

In the near future, ASPE plans to

- Expand School, Trade and Higher education assistance to more students and more area.
- Increase local volunteers' strength
- Establish overseas regional management structure
- Look for school building project
